Lions need to be relevant

Usually when we say "We Serve" we mean we meet the needs of our communities and the world.

But have you ever considered that one of the greatest needs that exist in our communities is the need to serve? It's true. Especially in hard times generous, open-hearted people turn their empathy and good intentions into action and results.

I think it comes down to this: people need to be relevant. People need to make a difference in the world. As with many needs in our communities a Lions Club is the perfect vehicle to meet this universal need among our neighbors and friends. But your club can only meet this need if it is itself relevant to the community and to your membership... Does your club meet your member's needs to be involved in their community?

They live at the Peace Village in Oberhausen while receiving medical treatment they could not possibly receive at home. Many, for the first time, are spending months in a peaceful, safe environment.

... the most powerful recruiting and retention tool your club can have is a strong program of effective and relevant service projects. Relevance leads to recognition. Recognition leads to respect. When your club is recognized and respected as a meaningful and satisfying way for individuals to channel their energies into community service, your invitations to new members will fall on fertile ground.

#### **Chatham Lions Recycle**

The Chatham Lions Club is involved in a project which offers 3 benefits. First, by recycling pop cans, water bottles, plastic tubs and grocery bags, we reduce the amount of material that ends up in landfills. Second, we remove the tabs from the pop cans and give them to Lion Carl Newton who is the driving force behind a project to purchase a new wheelchair for a local resident. Lion Carl told us that we need to collect 3 45 gallon barrels of tabs to pay for the chair and we already have about 1 and 2/3 barrels saved

Also, one of our members has agreed to crush the cans and store them until we have accumulated an economical quantity to sell to a local recycler. The proceeds will be deposited into our Administrative Account.

During a recent tour of Chatham Outreach for Hunger, our local food hank, we were told of their need for plastic water bottles to re pack liquids such as dish soap, shampoo, liquid laundry detergent etc. They also use plastic tubs for items such as flour, coffee, milk. powder, etc and give grocery bags to their clients to carry their food items home.

Lion (Dr.) Harry Wismer, Vice Chairman of District A-1 Lions Sight Conservation Foundation (Eyes Right) presented the final payment of \$11,344.18 (total cost \$31,344.18) for the new Yag laser for the St. Thomas Elgin General Hospital to Dr. Lori Teeple, head of the Emergency department of the St. Thomas Elgin General specializing in rehabilitation and palliative care. The presentation was made at District A-1 Cabinet meeting held at the Strathroy Lions Hall.
