We, the Lions of MDA made a decision a few years ago to submit a bid to host the International Convention in Toronto. That bid was accepted and the Lions of MDA were given the honour of hosting the convention in 2014.

This is an excellent opportunity for the Lions of MDA to invite the Lions of the world to experience our many attractions and to learn more about what makes our country so great. But we need the support of MDA Lions to succeed in this endeavour.

We can support this venture basically in 3 ways by:

- 1. registering to attend the convention
- 2. providing financial support to the Host Committee
- 3. volunteering to assist at the convention

1. Attending the Convention

Attendance at the convention, for many, will be a once in a lifetime opportunity to experience the thrill of attending an International Convention, where 30-40 thousand Lions from all over the world will assemble. You will experience firsthand the fun and fellowship of the huge multinational and multicultural gala event. More information is contained in the brochure.

Just a reminder that volunteers will be able to register at the early bird rate of \$110 up to the date of the convention.

2. Financial Support

As for any event, there are upfront costs to promote and host the International Convention. Lions of MDA made the commitment to provide the necessary financial support. November 14, 2013, World Diabetes Day, the inaugural Diabetic Alert Dog Guides Class graduated from Lions Foundation of Canada. These dogs are trained to detect drops in their client's blood sugars and alert them by their scent.

Individuals with Type 1 Diabetes with hypoglycemic unawareness cannot detect when their blood sugar drops and this puts them at risk of losing consciousness, falling into a coma and even dying. These Dog Guides can alert the diabetic so they can ingest something to elevate their blood sugar. They also bark for help or activate an alert system if needed. These Dog Guides are available to people age ten and up.

The other types of service dogs available through Lions Foundation of Canada are Canine Vision Dog Guides, Hearing Ear Dog Guides, Special Skills Dog Guides, Seizure Response Dog Guides and Autism Assistance Dog Guides.

I am available to come to your club and give a presentation if you would like further information on the Lions Foundation of Canada and their various programs.

During the month of May, the Purina Walk for Dog Guides takes place. Hosting a walk is easy and fun! The Lions Foundation provides an organizer's manual, donation forms, posters, participant incentive prizes, and media support. Just give them a call. I am also available if you need any assistance in your area in the way of obtaining pamphlets, etc., and assisting on the actual day of the walk. Just contact me.
