November is Crohn's and Colitis Month

Is Inflammatory Bowel Disease (IBD) the same as Irritable Bowel Syndrome (IBS)?

While often confused because their names are similar and their symptoms can seem comparable, **the two are not the same**. Both affect the digestive tract. However, with inflammatory bowel disease, inflammation is the key characteristic. In irritable bowel syndrome it is thought that problems arise because of changes to bowel function or the way the brain senses what is going on in the bowel; inflammation does not play a role. It is possible to have IBS if you have been diagnosed with IBD. It is also possible to have just one or the other.

Over 200,000 Canadians suffer from inflammatory bowel disease. IBD affects more people than multiple sclerosis or HIV and is almost as prevalent as epilepsy and Type 1 diabetes. In spite of that, IBD remains a closet disease, shrouded in silence and relatively unknown.

Why is that? Perhaps it is because people with Crohn's disease (CD) and ulcerative colitis (UC) are reluctant to speak out about health issues that have been taboo in polite conversation. It's time for that to stop. **We need to bring this conversation out into the open and talk about a disease that strikes more than 9,000 new patients every year.**

The Costs of IBD - Canada has one of the highest incidences of IBD in the world. With an annual cost of \$1.8 billion to individuals, their families and society at large, the burden of IBD is significant. In addition to the direct expenses to the health care system, it is estimated that IBD incurs more than a \$1 billion dollars every year in indirect costs like short and long-term work absences, productivity losses, caregiver work absences and patient out-of-pocket expenses related to care, nutritional products, medication and complementary therapies.

The risk of premature death for IBD sufferers is 47 per cent higher than the general public, and the risk of developing colorectal cancer is also elevated.

Challenges - Because they are often embarrassing to talk about, social stigma and the silence surrounding CD and UC lead to a lack of public understanding about the impact of IBD. **IBD is currently not considered a chronic disease under government health strategies**. An enhanced level of public and governmental awareness needs to be developed so that improved access to IBD specialists, procedures and medication can be established nationally. Also, improved employer understanding of the challenges inherent in these diseases would be enormously helpful to those living and working with the daily challenges of these diseases.

What is the purpose of the Crohn's and Colitis Foundation of Canada? - CCFC's Mission is to "Find the Cure". They are dedicated to raising money for research into the cause of Inflammatory Bowel Disease. In the pursuit of that cure, medical treatments will be discovered that will alleviate the suffering and pain that IBD patients experience. CCFC is also dedicated to helping people learn about their disease. WHEN CAN POPPIES BE WORN DAILY?

The official start of the Poppy Campaign is the last Friday in October. This year the campaign runs from Oct 28 to Nov 11. Presentations of the poppies to dignitaries such as the Gov General, the Lieutenant Governors and Premiers, are normally made in advance of the official campaign start date. The distribution of poppies to the general public commences on October 28 and can be worn any time after that date.

IS IT PROPER TO WEAR A POPPY TO COMMEMORATIVE EVENTS AT ANY POINT DURING THE CALENDAR YEAR OR SHOULD THE POPPY BE WORN ONLY DURING THE POPPY CAMPAIGN?

Although it is tradition for the Poppy to be worn only during the annual Remembrance period, a person may wear a Poppy any time he or she wishes to do so. It is not unusual for Poppies to be worn at commemorative events throughout the year, particularly during Veterans Affairs Canada (VAC) pilgrimages. The best approach is to follow the lead of the event organizers. If you are organizing the event, you can seek advice from VAC senior officials or the Royal Canadian Legion.

HOW SHOULD THE POPPY BE WORN?

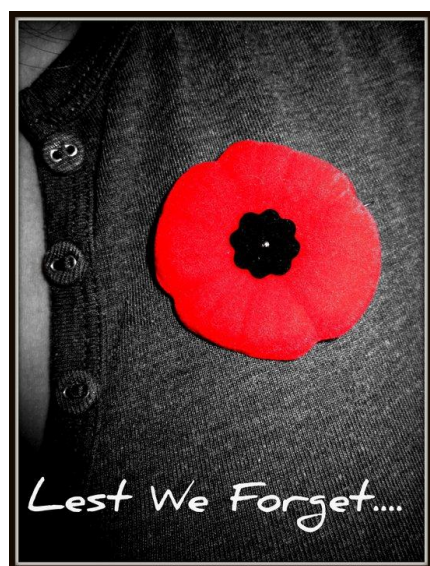
The Royal Canadian Legion suggests that the Poppy be worn on the left lapel of a garment or as close to the heart as possible.

I know it's early, but as this will be the last issue before Christmas, I want to wish each and every one of you the joy of family, happiness of friends and the love of Christmas.

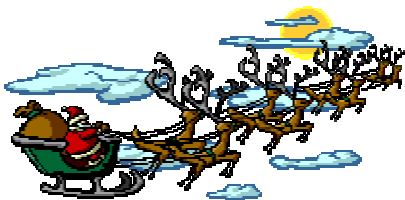

- 2 boxes bugles
- 1 box Crispix
- 1 box Cheerios
- 1 box pretzels
- 2 lb. Mixed nuts
- 2 T. Worcestershire sauce
- 2 T. Garlic powder
