FYI Greetings from the Canadian Eye Glass Recycling Centre ("CLERC"").

Over the past three years CLERC has under gone significant changes. From the passing of Bernie Gribben to opening our own warehouse and workshop outside of the Corrections facility in Calgary. In the past two years, to assist with the sorting of glasses, CLERC has entered into agreements with a church in Montreal and a sorting centre at a Corrections facility in Brandon. CLERC is currently working to open a sorting centre in the Maritimes. These changes occurred due to the cancellation of transportation agreements with our trucking partners and also to reduce costs. We are looking for a cost effective way of transporting the donated glasses that Lions Clubs have collected to our sorting facilities. Any suggestions or assistance would be greatly appreciated.

CLERC will begin publishing a newsletter beginning March, 2015 to share celebrations and, yes, frustrations. Articles and pictures from organizations that receive our glasses will also be included. Copies of the newsletter will be forwarded to all Governors and will also be available on our website. We welcome any articles or pictures that Lions Clubs wish to submit. Lions will now see periodically that we are making a difference in the lives of the recipients.

CLERC accepts all eye glasses: - Sunglasses (including non-prescription); - Reading glasses; - Children's- Frames with no lenses; and - Broken and/or scratched. Any glasses or frames that cannot be used are sent to another recycling company. This company uses the plastic and glass for reflective paint and the metal is recycled. We are working to keep as much as we can out of our landfills. At present cases cannot be used or recycled as we have no means of sterilizing them. The weight is also prohibitive when shipping.

CLERC's operations are completely funded through donations from Lions Clubs in Canada and other organizations. Your continued support and assistance is essential in efforts to meet the challenge to be Knights of the Blind.
