Holding the event in Nairobi enabled participants to focus on preventable blindness, food security, environmental sustainability and other issues of special importance in Africa.

Protecting our Environment

In April, Lions Clubs around the world took up the challenge of protecting our environment by organizing community-wide clean-ups, recycling, raising awareness about threats to the environment, and educating members of their communities on what they can do to make a difference.

In the fourth and final of this year's Global Service Action

Campaigns, clubs in more than 60 countries have dedicated nearly 100,000 Lions service hours to more than 1,000 environmental projects. The campaign was scheduled in April to coincide with the worldwide observance of Earth Day. In one



Protecting the Environment project, the Meercedes Lions club in Texas, USA, refurbished and painted 10 trash containers and worked with city officials to place them in the Little League and Pony League parks in the City of Mercedes.
