GMT Lion George Croft said Thanks to all the Zone Chairs who have welcomed out Team members as guest speakers at their Zone Advisory meetings. We were also able to distribute at those meetings envelopes to each club president containing District GMT club growth ideas plus LCI club growth pamphlets. Our team continues to participate in the new LCI GMT Netcasts and MDA Webinars wherein information is shared worldwide re club growth. We recently E-mailed to the clubs, with the able assistance of District Secretary Ron, further ideas to assist them in growing the clubs throughout our district. We, along with the GLT Team, are encouraging clubs to buy into the Club Excellence Process. GMT Team member and 1st VDG Bob Tanner has been scheduling visitations to certain clubs to further this process. ZC Sandy Leadlay of our GMT Team and the London Central Lions club (particularly Pres. Jim and Lions Joanne, Ed and Don) have worked very hard to ensure the formation of the Fanshawe College Lions club. Congratulations on a great effort. Governor Wayne's welcome letters to new members should motivate them to attend the District convention and 1st VDG Bob Tanner's Orientation session on Saturday afternoon. All clubs should ensure that Governor Wayne receives the names and mailing addresses of all new members to facilitate their receiving the welcome letters. The GMT Team is fully participating in the efforts of the GLT Team with the club officer training sessions Saturday afternoon at the convention. Please contact any member of the GMT Team – 1st VDG Bob Tanner, PDG Don McKessock, CT Eric Dolansky and ZC Sandy Leadlay for assistance re club growth and revitalization.

**Hearing/Work with the Deaf ZC Barb Tuxford stated** thanks to all clubs who have committed funds to Lions Home for the Deaf, some have let me know I would like to encourage clubs to donate to the new home in London.

Lake Joseph Transportation Lion Peter Best reported this year's project is getting off to a slow start. At this point I have little to report that is confirmed. However we have been in discussion and setting dates for the camp week was a bit of a challenge as the CNIB Lake Joseph Centre had a number of events planned and it took some time work things out. We are continuing to work on the details. At this point the camp period for our group this summer will run from Sunday July 14 to Saturday July 20. A request for the bus charters has gone out and a quote has been received for a cost of: \$1985.00 + hst \$258.05 per trip, With the return trip the total charter will cost \$4486.10. This will be equal to last year. The camper applications have been sent out and I am in the process of developing a passenger list. Travel details will not be work out until later in the spring. I should have a more complete report for the April District Meeting. Donations have been coming in slowly, but we will need more support to continue to provide this service. I would like to encourage each club to give a little, to ensure the wheels keep on rolling so that the blind and visually impaired campers in our area can travel safely, conveniently and affordably to and from the camp. Our service brings, them a sense of independence and pleasant memories.

**L.C.I.F. PDG Don McKessock** stated we would like see District A-1 Lions donating \$12,000 to LCIF A-1 this year – but more importantly, we would like to see at least half of the Clubs in District A-1 extending their support outside of District A-1 to world. After all, as every member of Lions Clubs International should know, the world is our home.

12,000 is a large number: but not when you realize LCIF, your foundation, is in the business of saving the sight of 30 million people – AGAIN! 12,000 is a very modest contribution. **Leader Dogs for the Blind PZC Valerie Burningham** stated The Vision Statement, Mission Statement and Values have been updated to better reflect the goals of the Leader Dog for the Blind organization.

**Vision Statement**: to be the leading guide dog organization providing sustainable value to our clients.

**Mission Statement**: Empowering people who are blind or visually impaired with lifelong skills for independent travel through

- quality Leader Dogs
- highly effective client instruction
- innovative services

## Values:

- respect and compassion for people and dogs
- passion for the work
- safety in all we do
- do what is right
- innovation in our field
- teamwork
- superior experience for stakeholders

In 2011-2012 clubs from District A-1 donated \$13,549.00, I asked if it would be possible to increase that a bit, and show how we as Lions can be true knights for the blind and help these individuals gain some independence. In the last report I have that includes 2 club donations not recorded as yet, we as a district have contributed \$16,090.71, thank you Lions let's keep that growing. When I attended the Leader Dog Kick Off onsite at Leader Dog School for the Blind I was honoured to represent the District and present the cheques that were sent to me, thank you. At that same function I have to say I saw PDG, current District Secretary Lion Ron Devos totally speechless as he was presented with the Leader Dog's Presidents Award, congratulations Lion Ron.

Currently we have 19 active Leader Dog graduates in our district and soon we will hopefully have another as there is a CNIB client from Chatham who has been accepted into the program. She goes over to begin her training March 3<sup>rd</sup>. As well, in keeping in

touch Lion Mickey Puddicomb from the Windsor Downtown Lions has been asked to make calls to clubs who have earned a Top Dog Award, she is really enjoying the conversations and enjoys keeping in contact with her fellow graduates. As said before I can help to arrange speakers to come out to your clubs. I am in regular contact with Mike Dengate, Lions Regional Representative at Leader Dogs for the Blind in Rochester, and have been promised his full support in our endeavours. He has been and continues to be a wealth of information for which I am very grateful.

**Youth Exchange Incoming PZC Curtis Marwood** reported requests from YE Chairs from other districts are coming in and they are anxious to hear if we have a place for their youth in our program and camp. I have requests from 17 countries. From those requests I have 11 applications. They are asking me to hold a place for one or two youth or have already sent me applications and are hoping for an answer. As I explained at the June meeting last year I had decided that I hope to have host families confirmed by March 15 so that I could assure the youth that I would have a host family for them in time for them to finalize their plans. I also committed to you that I would only accept the number of youth for whom I have host families. Therefore, I am asking those who might be thinking about hosting this year to let me know soon. I would like to confirm the applications I have. Therefore, I hope to hear from potential hosts soon. I plan to be in touch with the camp team soon to begin to plan the program.

**Youth Exchange Outgoing PDG Evelyn Spiering** reported I have had a few enquiries but only one student has given me their application her name is Julianna Schiller you may recognize the name as she is also a participant in the Effective Speaking, she will be sponsored by the Delaware Lions Club and is hoping to be accepted into the exchange program in Portugal.

## **OLD BUSINESS**

After a lengthy discussion about the A7/11 Sick Kids Project it was decided to have the District Cabinet Secretary send out a request to all clubs in District A-1 asking them to reply back to the Secretary if their club is in favour of supporting this project or not. The clubs have brought in 64 New Members but we have dropped 78 Members. Governor Wayne stated we are doing a great job bringing in New Members but we need to work on retaining our current Members.
