DISTRICT CHAIRS REPORTS

The following are the highlights from the District Chairs Reports:

Constitution & Bylaws – PDG Bill Sasse reported further to my report to Cabinet August 26th 2012, suggesting a thorough review of the District A-1 Constitution & Bylaws to ensure that all provisions remain valid, organized and in accordance with the International Constitution and By-laws, I can report the following.

As directed, a review of the District A-1 Constitution & By-laws was conducted. As a result of that review, it was discovered that some provisions are inconsistent with current policy and practices.

A resolution was adopted at the April 30th 2013 Research & Long Range Planning meeting recommending to Cabinet that the District A-1 Constitution & By-laws review continue with a view to re-structuring using the Standard District Constitution and By-laws provided by Lions Clubs International as the model.

The major benefit of adopting the Standard Form District Constitution and By-laws would be that it would be automatically updated each year reflecting any changes that are adopted by the Lions Clubs International Board of Directors. These changes would automatically be reflected in the District A-1 Constitution and By-laws following the annual International Convention.

Some of the changes that would be noted under the new format would include:

- Some re-wording of the existing provisions of the District A-1 Constitution and By-laws
- The removal of some provisions currently contained in the District A1 Constitution and By-laws and re-inserted in the District A-1 Policy and Procedures Manual
- The addition of some new provisions to the District A-1 Constitution and By-laws
 under the Standard Form District Constitution and By-laws format. The
 additional provisions would include Dispute Resolution procedures, proper
 amending procedures, automatic update in accordance with amendments adopted
 by the Lions Clubs international Board of Directors

The proposed District A-1 Constitution and By-laws in the Standard format would be much easier to maintain and update. The revisions and amendments would be inserted in a much more organized fashion. The Standard format would also provide a District Constitution and By-laws that is consistent with the International Association policy. It would be my recommendation that any provisions that are removed from the District A-1 Constitution and By-laws and inserted in the District A-1 Policy and Procedures Manual be transferred to the Policy Manual in the exact form that they currently exist in the Constitution and By-laws. The provisions transferred to the Policy Manual, could then be updated with the approval Cabinet to conform to current LCI Policy. The process would continue with a draft document being prepared complete the appropriate explanatory notes for review by Cabinet. If endorsed, it could then be presented to the delegates on the ballot at the annual convention.

Diabetes Awareness-Lion Bev Wirta reported I would like to thank all the Lions Clubs' in the district for their participation in Tag Day, Door to Door Canvassing, monetary support to the Canadian Diabetes Association, the Diabetes camps and the help and support given to individuals affected by diabetes. In April, the Lions/CDA Liason Committee held their meeting to make plans for this year's Tag Day. We have received many comments and recommendations from Lions Clubs across Canada regarding the actual date of the event. The 2 to 3 weekends before Remembrance Day affected many clubs because the members either helped with the local Legions or did not want to compete for monetary support with the Veterans'. The other concern was weather. Depending where you live, late November can be very cold to be standing outside. So the Committee has made the recommendation that the Club's can pick any date between October 15 and November 30 (which is officially Diabetes month) to hold their individual Tag Day. The official date of Tag Day is Saturday, November 16. If your club would like to participate this year, please let me know and I will make sure that you have the supplies required for the day. I have been advised that the manager of the Sarnia CDA office will be retiring on August 31 this year. Sharon Cathcart has been with the

CDA for 25 years and has been a great support and reference for my needs as District Chair but I am looking forward to working with her replacement. On Friday, June 7, I and two members from the Bluewater Lions Club of Sarnia volunteered at the annual CDA Golf Tournament in Camlachie. It was a great day and three of us raised \$830 from 50/50 sales and doing the putting contest. It was fun and it showed the Lions' association with CDA. I would highly recommend your club participate in these events with your local CDA offices. Thank you Governor Wayne for your support and the opportunity you have given me to be District Chair. Each year as I talk to more people in the community and hear their stories, my passion and commitment grows. Thank you fellow Lions for your support and enjoy your summer.

District A-1 Convention-PDG Don McKessock reported this year the District A-1 Convention was held in Leamington ON at the Pelee Days Inn on April 12 -14, 2013. Feedback on the Convention has been quite positive. In fact only 8 suggestions for improvement were received from attendees this year, and for the most part, they were quite minor. Most feedback commented on the fact that the convention was "well organized". It is a tribute to the good work of the convention team that there were few glitches during convention weekend. There were over 452 events to manage and over 150 tasks to be completed ... all this requires a dedicated and co-ordinated effort by the Convention Committee. Thank-you team.

- <u>Highlights</u>
 - Several changes were drafted for the Convention Policy Manual. These changes clarified convention committee organization & financial guidelines.
 - The team worked on a list of 35 improvement items. Major and subtle changes to many convention events were made to resolve 29 of these items.
 - 6 Convention meetings were held plus 1 conference by telephone and 1 conference via internet. Minimizing meetings is important. Each meeting involves up to 1500 travel kms and 20 hours of travel time!
 - 4 promotions were sent out prior to the convention to make the Lions family aware of convention events and encourage attendance.
 - A record number of breakout sessions (8) were conducted... Not an easy feat considering the time and space restrictions at the Leamington site.
 - A list of 20 improvement items, most somewhat minor, have been made available to the 2014 convention team. Each year, we should strive to get better.

Effective Speaking – PRC Mary Mahovlich reported I am proud to announce that the 3rd Place Junior English Winner of the M.D."A" Contest was 13 year old Marissa Muller sponsored by the Petrolia Lions Club. Her topic was "Better Not Bitter". Plans are already in the works for next year's M.D."A" Effective Speaking Contest. District 12 has volunteered to run the contest. I did not volunteer our District. This year 9 out of 10 Districts sent a total of 36 Contestants in 6 categories. 7 of the Districts including ours sent only 3 contestants, due to not having contestants in all categories. The 3 French categories had a total of 10 contestants. Most of our Club & District Contestants were "Junior English" with Only 1 "Intermediate French". 4 clubs had a total of 28 participants with 16 going to the District Contest in Chatham. Donations were received from 27 Lions Clubs and 10 Lioness clubs totaling \$5,575.00. Monies spent to date totaled \$4,554.22 there will be an additional cost for year bars and postage etc. Total cost of the District Contest was \$858.22 this included plagues \$44.07, Gift certificates \$75, Hall Rental, \$150, Prizes \$550 and \$25.99 engraving. Total forwarded to M.D."A" & Host District was \$3,696. This included \$200 start up, \$200 for pins, a \$45 donation per club \$1,620., and \$1,676 for meals & rooms. Thank You everyone for you support and to Governor Wayne for giving me this position.

Environment – PDG Ev Spiering stated always an important topic however the clubs who are participating in reduce, recycle and reuse are reluctant to report on their activities. Lions be proud of the efforts your club is doing in this area. For those club who are possibly looking for a way to help and maybe raise a few dollars for their club have you ever thought of e-waste (electronic recycling)I was recently introduced to this process through the District chair for A16 Sylvia and her husband Dale McClease both Lions with the Maple Lions Club if you would like to learn more please email them at lionsewaste@gmail.com, or if you visit youtube you can check out their video under Maple Lions Club.

Lake Joseph Transportation – Lion Peter Best reported I reported in April that this year's project is moving along slowly, but surely and that I intended to have a more detailed report for Cabinet for the June meeting. Unfortunately, it is still a little too early for me to have all the details together to report. However I would like to assure that the project is following its usual course and I expect everything to work out well. The camp dates for this summer are Sunday July 14 to Saturday July 20. The bus charters have been arranged. The cost will be \$1985.00 + hst \$258.05 per trip, totaling a cost of \$4486.10, similar to last year. The camper application and reservations have been completed forming a travel list of thirty campers. I am still waiting on final confirmation for the escort accommodation details. A proposal was discussed with the CNIB LJC, which was agreed to in principle, however I am waiting for written confirmation before acknowledging the agreement. Some of our long time repeat passenger campers have indicated they are not interested in returning to the camp for various reasons, however our numbers for service request has not dropped as we have several new eager, excited

passengers. The physical ability of clients is changing as we are tending to be assisting more functionally challenged vacationers, which is making our service all the more valuable to those with few vacation options. It also emphasizes the need for two bus escorts. The campers and their families have been expressing joy and appreciation that we are continuing, as without what we are providing they would have little to look forward to for their summer. The tentative travel schedule is planned to leave Windsor Sunday July 14, 2013 at 7:30 am and arrive in London at the MacDonald's at hwy 401 and Wellington Rd at 9:30am for our annual brunch stop over. It would be appreciated if I can have some Lion volunteers to meet us and assist. We will be departing at 10:30am for our trip north. Please advise if you will be coming out to participate and share in the excitement of the campers. With each report as I try to describe the value of this service, I find that I am unable to come close to that of experiencing the opportunity of offering this service to those who get so much from it. Please remember it is only with your support that this project can continue to keep serving those in our communities. I would like to encourage each club to give a little, to ensure the wheels keep on rolling so that the blind and visually impaired campers in our area can travel safely, conveniently and affordably to and from the camp.

Our service brings, them a sense of independence and pleasant memories.

Photo Contest – PDG Ev Spiering reported thanks you to Lioness Nancy Wright, Wheatley Lioness Club and Lion Dale Armstrong Dorchester Lions Club for your submissions into the Districts Photo Contest. I am envious or those who can capture the perfect photo. The winner was Lioness Nancy Wright; her photo was then submitted to the MDA Photo contest. And I am happy to announce that Lioness Nancy's photo was once again victorious. Her Photo will now be sent to LCI for their contest and will be on display in 2014 in Toronto.

Reseach & Long Range Planning – PDG Bill Bissonnette reported at our last Long Range Planning meeting on April 30, a number of items were discussed:

- ➤ Lions Home for the Deaf- A new home is being built in NW London and is being named for Gary Martins of the Lambeth Lions Club. We need to support this through Helen Keller donations.
- ➤ Recommendation to Cabinet that we adopt the LCI Standard Form District Constitution & Bylaws incorporating provisions of our existing District A-1 Constitution & Bylaws.
- > Recommendation to Cabinet that District A-1 re-institute the International Director Fund @ \$1.00 per member per year capped at \$25,000.
- > Recommendation to Cabinet that the District Secretary start a Motion Book.

C0-Youth Exchange Inbound – PZC Lion Curtis Marwood stated I am glad to report that plans for the 2013 District A1 Lions Youth Exchange programme and the Lion Al Betterley Camp are almost complete. I have host families for 14 youth (11 girls and 3 boys) from 16 to 22. They represent 12 countries. The plan to recruit host families early this year had its frustrations but in the end was successful and made my life much easier knowing that I had host families before I accepted the youth. However, waiting for the

host families meant frustration for the youth and their district chairs. They are anxious to know in February. We could have had the opportunity to have more youth if I had more host families earlier. We will continue to encourage you to help recruit hosts and try to get the hosts to respond earlier. I deeply appreciate the support of the district in enabling us to continue to have a youth exchange. I know I put the pressure on but this year we were trying to make a change to an earlier schedule. In the end, it has been good. I want to thank all the host families this year, especially the new ones. The camp leadership team of Lioness Carrol Vincent, Lion Bob Book, Lion Cheryl Schleihauf and I have met to finalize the camp schedule. The camp team will be meeting again July 3 after the youth arrive and have settled in to their first host family. The youth arrive on June 29. I am still waiting for some of the tickets from the youth so I can plan the pickup arrangements. I will be asking the hosts for the first week to consider helping. The host family change over will be on July 10 at the North Buxton Community Park. Chatham Lions will be hosting the lunch for the youth and their hosts.

Camp begins on July 20. We will be asking the hosts of the second term to bring their youth to the camp by 12 noon. Lunch will be provided at the camp for the youth and their hosts at 1 pm before the opening ceremony.

The camp schedule will include trips to

Sunday - Fort Malden in Amherstburg and Windsor River Cruise,

Monday – Canada's Wonderland

Tuesday – Rondeau Park, with a guided walk and swimming.

Wednesday – Niagara Falls – dinner by Chippewa Lions

Thursday – Lions Foundation (Oakville) and Arkona Rock Glen.

Friday – (July 26) International Day – Host Families and Lions invited for dinner and closing ceremony.

Saturday – to the airport.

Thanks to the following clubs who will be providing meals and paying for some of the trips: Mt. Brydges Lions, Belmont Lions, Windsor Lioness, Glencoe Lions, Chippewa Lions, Strathroy Lions, St. Thomas Lions and Lambeth Lions.
