Lake Joseph Transportation – Lion Peter Best

Objective: To provide safe, convenient, low-cost transportation to and from the CNIB Lake Joseph Centre for blind, deaf/blind, visually impaired, their escorts and dog guides

As the summer months approach details for our annual transportation project are starting to come together and camper anticipation is growing. As reported previously camp dates are set for August 17 to 23, 2014, a later period was selected to give our campers a better opportunity to integrate with other active campers.

Elaine has once again volunteered to join us on our journey to support and assist our campers for a safe, pleasurable experience. While at the camp we will continue to offer support to our campers. We will depart Windsor Sunday August 17th from Lions' Manor at 7:30am, arriving in London at McDonald's at HWY #401 and Wellington Rd. where we will greet more passengers from, the surrounding area. It is my hope that once again some Lions in that area will join us for breakfast and to assist, experiencing the joy that we are giving to this group. Batter Bus Lines has been chartered for both the to and from trips for \$ 4553.95.

Cash held for travel expenses & preparation as of May 15, 2014 in the Royal bank is \$90.17 Last year's expenses were approximately \$435. I am therefore requesting a top up \$350.00 to cover this seasons travel expenses and preparations.

Fundraising is somewhat of a challenge in that some funding is sent directly to the District Treasurer and some is sent to me to be forwarded to the District treasurer and therefore unless I get an update on our account status, I do not know the details of who has contributed or our account balance and I am not able to report. I suggest occasional updates would be helpful.

As previously reported I have agreed to honour my commitment to co-ordinate this season's transportation and try to make it another successful fun adventure. However I have decided that after 27 seasons, it is time for fresh energy and new ideas. Last September when Governor Bob Tanner met a small delegation that represented a cross-section of our campers, he heard their experiences and frustration with the CNIB LJC camp and desire for service improvements. They also expressed their gratitude for the Lions' enduring support and appreciation for our Transportation Project and the creation of the camp they love. Governor Bob Tanner indicated he understood their concerns and made them a promise to investigate and resolve their concerns. Feeling assured that he would follow through, I have left this matter to him and have offered to be available for consultation should he or CNIB be interested in my opinion.

I have decided to concentrate my service more regionally where I can assist individuals locally. As to the 2015 season, I will not serve as District Chairman for this project Conclusion:

When the clients and their families heard that I would not be continuing, they expressed further frustration and disappointment. I responded that I would encourage the continuation of transportation assistance. There is a need and a value in continuing to offer to the blind and

visually impaired in our District services that can ameliorate the condition of blindness. Transportation is a major concern amongst most blind individuals. Alleviating transportation barriers, creates independence and opportunity. It is my hope that Cabinet will see the value and continue to encourage and enable those to venture out to enjoy life.

C0-Youth Exchange Inbound – PZC Lion Curtis Marwood

We are ready for the youth to arrive on June 28. We have 12 youth arriving from 11 countries, 15 host families, 5 camp leaders and possibly one or two Canadian campers. The youth and hosts have been matched and are introducing themselves to each other by email.

Three members of the A1 YE team attended the MDA YE meeting on April 26 in Markham. The camp program is scaled back a bit this year to allow more time in camp for community building. This was the recommendation of the youth for last year. It will also save some money for travel and event admission fees but we will need to do some serious planning to fill the in camp time.

The host will be advised of the camp activities so that they can avoid duplicating activities with the youth they are hosting. The camp activities include:

- 1. LFC Dog Guide school & Canada's Wonderland
- 2. Niagara Falls
- 3. Ice Sculture plant in Hensall & Grand Bend Beach

I have submitted a budget to the treasurer and attached it to this report for the secretary to include in the District file. We hope to be able to replace the foam mattresses, and purchase some pillows, pillow cases and towels. We have been offered some tents from a Girl Guide group. At last count, the District YE account has a balance of \$8545. Our estimate of expenses is \$8200. Twenty-four Lions/Lioness clubs have donated and 7 clubs have offered to provide meals during the camp. Your support provides the opportunity for the youth to experience an event of a life time which builds bridges of international understanding and hopefully promote peace in the world. On behalf of the YE team (co-Chair Carrol Vincent, Cheryl Schleihauf, Bob Book and Ev Spiering) I want to thank Governor Bob, the host families and the clubs who have supported the Youth Exchange program with donations and/or hosting the camp meals. **PZC Lion Curtis also presented the clubs present with a Youth Exchange Patch for their donation.**

Constitution & Bylaw Committee

As you know, a new District A1 Constitution & Bylaws, in the LCI Standard format, was approved by the delegates at the 2014 District A1 Convention in April of this year. A hard copy has been produced in the new format and has been duly signed by the Governor, Cabinet Secretary and chairperson of the Constitution and Bylaw committee. Therefore, it is now ready to be entered on the District A1 website for reference of all members of the district. As previously recommended, certain provisions contained in the former District A1 Constitution & Bylaws and not contained in the new version would be moved to the District A1 Policy Manual. The items to be moved to the policy manual are very few in number since practically all provisions contained in the former Constitution & Bylaws are depicted in the new edition.

The most notable item removed from the new Constitution and Bylaws is the structure and duties of the Finance Committee. Since those provisions require that a District Finance Committee be established following the District A-1 Convention and before June 30th, it is recommended that Cabinet adopt a resolution today to amend the District A1 Policy Manual to include the following provisions in Chapter 1, item 2 of the District A1 Policy manual.

- i) There shall be a District Finance Committee to be established following the District A-1 Convention and before June 30th, which shall consist of the District Governor, the District Governor-Elect, Vice District Governor the Cabinet Treasurer (or the Cabinet Secretary-Treasurer), the Incoming Cabinet Treasurer (or the Incoming Cabinet Secretary-Treasurer), and four appointed members.
- ii) One of the four appointed members will be replaced each year on a rotating basis by the District Governor with the senior member being replaced. No member shall serve for more than four consecutive years. In the event that a vacancy occurs, the vacancy shall be filled by appointment by the District Governor for the unexpired term thereof.
- iii) The 3rd year member of the District Finance Committee shall be chairman.
- iv) This Committee shall be responsible for the preparation of a District Budget which shall be submitted to the District Cabinet for approval at its first meeting. This Committee shall also continually monitor the implementation of the Budget and the general condition of the District Funds throughout the year.

There are other provisions in the District A1 Policy Manual that need to be amended as well. For example, the District A1 Policy Manual provides that certain committees could be granted administrative authority by a majority vote of the Cabinet. It is recommended that this proviso be repealed since all management decisions should be made by Cabinet, albeit occasionally on the advice of a committee. I believe there should be only one administrative body in the district and that is the District Cabinet.

On reviewing the policy manual it is my recommendation that a number of housekeeping adjustments be performed to bring it in line with current practices and procedures. In the process, I further recommend that section numbers be listed numerically throughout document and delete the term chapter in the document. This recommendation is suggested to enable easier reference to the provisions of the District A1 Policy Manual.

If cabinet is in agreement, I would ask for a motion of cabinet to authorize the Chairperson of the Constitution & Bylaws Committee to prepare a draft revised District A1 Policy Manual for Cabinet's review and consideration at a future meeting.

I thought I would start with a bit of history.

It all started with "\$400 and a hatful of ideas." - Donald P. Schuur.

On April 4, 1939, the Articles of Incorporation (Non-Profit) for the Lions Leader Dog Foundation* were signed by Charles A. Nutting, Donald P. Schurr and S.A. Dodge, members of the Uptown Lions Club of Detroit. Their motivation to form the organization came from their unsuccessful attempt to pay for a fellow Lion, Dr. Glenn "Doc" Wheeler, to get a guide dog from the only U.S. guide dog organization existing at the time.

The purpose of the corporation was stated as, "To train and distribute blind leader dogs to be known as Lions Leader Dogs among preferred blind people in the United States and Canada. To conduct a course of instruction for trainers of Lions Leader Dogs. To conduct a supervised course of training in order to coordinate a blind person with a Lions Leader Dog. To conduct research in order to ascertain the most desirable breed of dog for blind leader work and to conduct research in all other problems relating thereto.... In general, to conduct an educational and charitable foundation for the purposes indicated." *Changed to "Leader Dog League for the Blind" in 1940, then to "Leader Dogs for the Blind" in 1952.

So that was the beginning, now 75 years later, Leader Dogs for the Blind, service many Canadian graduates and they need your support. We have 18 active graduates in the District showing on the website. Leader Dogs for the Blind empower people who are blind and visually impaired with lifelong skills for independent travel and we can take pride in the fact that our Service to those who need the skills of a highly trained Leader Dog has enriched the lives of people across the country and around the world.

Thank you to the Kingsville Lions Club for inviting me and a Leader Dog graduate and her dog to the Kingsville Golf Tournament last month, and thank you Zone Chair Lion Jim Rigney for including Leader Dog at your last zone meeting. If you would like a speaker I would be pleased to hear from you. I can make arrangements for a graduate to visit and speak to your club members at a meeting.

Please consider Leader Dog for the Blind when you are setting your budgets for the coming Lions year. You will all be hearing from me over the summer, thank you and have a safe, enjoyable summer everyone.
