Last year (2008-09) Mission Services, through its residential facilities,

- provided 83,400 days of shelter
- served 239,293 meals.

- provided services\* for additional 837 individuals living on the street with a mental illness.

\*Those services ranged from a free meal to free clothing and household articles, from safe overnight accommodations to weeks of shelter and daily meals, from counseling to connections with other social service agencies and government services.



The theme this year is "HOPE + DIGNITY". In the coming months, we will be launching a new initiative called The Dignity Project. For most, living without dignity is a remote

concept. However, for too many Canadians, the necessities of life required for basic human dignity are out


#### 'TWAS THE NIGHT OF THANKSGIVING

# An Abridged History of THANKSGIVING!

Nothing says autumn has arrived like a feast fit for all of your relatives. In Canada, the roots of Thanksgiving run deep,

which isn't surprising considering our agricultural identity.

Long, long ago, celebrating the harvest and giving thanks for a successful bounty has a long tradition among First Nations. Across the Atlantic, European farmers celebrate the harvest, too, giving thanks by stuffing animal horns with seasonal goodies; the horn of plenty or cornucopia continues to be a symbol of the big day.

1578 – Explorer Martin Frobisher, looking for a northern passage to the Orient, holds a ceremony in the Canadian Arctic. He gives thanks for surviving the long, arduous voyage. Considered by most scholars as the first formal Thanksgiving celebration in North America.

1603 – Like their British cousins, the French hold feasts of thanks on Canadian soil.

1784 – After the American Revolution, Loyalists cross the border into Canada, bringing with them the customs and practices of an American Thanksgiving.

1872 – The first Thanksgiving Day after Canadian Confederation was observed as a civic holiday on April 5 to commemorate the recovery of the Prince of Wales (later Edward VII) from illness.

1879 – Official decree settles the date for Thanksgiving to November 6.

1957 – Parliament proclaims the observance of Thanksgiving on the second Monday in October to avoid a conflict with Remembrance Day with the emphasis on friends, family and turkey dinner.
