If your club is sponsoring a community event:


- Ask to have information posted on your community Web site or message board.

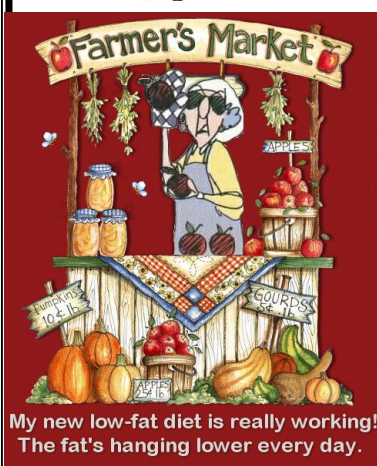
